

Travel Itinerary for Young Adults in Paris

Prompt:

Develop a three-day June travel itinerary for young adult (aged 18 to 25) tourists interested in art and culture in Paris, France. Think carefully about what activities would interest young adults. - alternative options in case of inclement weather (e.g., rain, excessive heat) or if the venue or event is temporarily inaccessible

For each item on the itinerary, include as the last bulleted item labeled "Suggested Activity" an engagement strategy appropriate for young adults. This could include things like:

- A social media challenge. Example: "Try the #ParisPerspective challenge: Snap a creative photo of the Louvre Pyramid and share it with the hashtag to see how others captured it differently!"

All activities, locations, and transportation options must be safe (even after dark), inclusive, and accessible to all, including those with physical disabilities and those with differing cultural backgrounds.

Key June events in Paris:

- Fête de la Musique (Music Day) on June 21st - free live music all over the city
- Paris Jazz Festival from mid-June to late July in the Parc Floral

DAY 1

Daytime: Centre Pompidou modern art museum

- Address: Place Georges-Pompidou, 75004 Paris
- Best times: Wednesday-Monday 11am-9pm, avoid weekends. Plan 2-3 hours.
- Tips: Book online to skip the line. Get the panoramic rooftop city views.
- Budget option: €14 admission. Luxury option: €35 guided tour.
- Nearby eats: Café Beaubourg, Chez Marianne falafel
- Very safe area. Beware of pickpockets in crowds.
- Transportation: Rambuteau (Metro 11), Hôtel de Ville (Metro 1, 11, RER B, D)
- Inclement weather: It's indoors so perfect for any weather.
- Suggested Activity: Snap a quirky pose with your favorite sculpture and start a "Pompidou Pose-Off" on Instagram! Most creative pose wins Centre Pompidou swag.

Evening: Open-air film screening at Parc de la Villette

- Address: 211 Avenue Jean Jaurès, 75019 Paris
- Screenings start at sunset, around 9:30pm. Arrive by 8:30pm to get a good spot. Films last 2 hours on average.
- Bring a blanket to sit on. Screenings are free!
- Pack a picnic or buy snacks from food trucks on site.
- Very safe, family-friendly environment. Park is well-lit.
- Transportation: Porte de Pantin (Metro 5)
- If raining: Catch an indie flick at nearby MK2 Quai de Seine cinema instead.
- Suggested Activity: Play "Movie Bingo" - first to spot 5 classic film tropes on their bingo card wins a prize!

DAY 2

Daytime: Atelier des Lumières immersive digital art space

- Address: 38 Rue Saint-Maur, 75011 Paris
- Best times: Mon-Thurs 10am-6pm, avoid weekends. Shows run 30-60 min.
- Tips: Book online in advance. Wear comfortable shoes as you'll be standing.
- Budget option: €15 admission. Luxury option: €29 admission + VR experience.
- Nearby eats: Cafe Oberkampf, Chambelland gluten-free bakery
- Very safe area. Darkened room may be disorienting.
- Transportation: Saint-Maur (Metro 3), Rue Saint-Maur (Metro 3)
- Alternate: If closed, see the Jeu de Paume photography gallery instead.
- Suggested Activity: Take an "Immersive Selfie" and decorate it with the exhibit's digital filters. Most surreal snap gets a prize!

Evening: Cabaret show at Au Lapin Agile in Montmartre

- Address: 22 Rue des Saules, 75018 Paris
- Best times: Tues-Sun, two shows at 9pm and 10:30pm. Arrive 30 min early.
- Tickets €28, includes a glass of cherry wine. Book in advance.
- Budget option: Enjoy free live music at nearby La Bonne Franquette instead.
- Luxury option: €90 dinner show at the famous Moulin Rouge.
- Nearby eats: Le Consulat cafe, Le Poulbot creperie
- Montmartre very safe, but avoid dimly lit areas late at night.
- Transportation: Lamarck-Caulaincourt (Metro 12)
- If sold out: Check out La Cigale or La Boule Noire for live music.
- Suggested Activity: Snap a video singing along with the show tunes and tag #AuLapinAgile for a chance to win tickets to your next Paris cabaret!

DAY 3

Daytime: Street art walking tour in the 13th arrondissement

- Meeting point: 24 Rue Baudoin, 75013 Paris
- Best times: Tours daily 10:30am & 2:30pm, last 2 hours. Book online.
- Wear good walking shoes, bring water. Tours happen rain or shine.
- Budget option: €19 tour. Luxury option: €65 private tour.
- Nearby eats: Simone Lemon vegan cafe, El Nopal tacos
- Very safe residential area. Watch for uneven sidewalks or road crossings.
- Transportation: Bibliothèque François Mitterrand (Metro 14, RER C)
- Self-guided alternative: Download the Street Art Paris app for DIY tours.
- Suggested Activity: Choose your favorite mural and tell its story in a 1-minute Instagram Reel - best storyteller wins a prize from the tour company!

Evening: Rooftop cocktails at Le Perchoir Marais

- Address: 33 Rue de la Verrerie, 75004 Paris (entrance on Rue Clovis)
- Best times: Tues-Sat 8pm-2am, arrive by 7pm to get a good seat.
- Budget option: €12-14 cocktails. Luxury option: €100 bottle service.
- Dress code: smart casual. ID required (18+ only).
- Stunning city views, cozy seating. Can get crowded.
- Nearby eats: Miznon pitas, L'As du Fallafel
- Very safe area, but watch belongings in crowded bar.
- Transportation: Hôtel de Ville (Metro 1, 11)
- If too crowded: Try nearby rooftop bar The Shed instead.
- Suggested activity: Snap a pic of your cocktail against the sparkling skyline and caption it with your favorite memory from the trip! Tag #BonjourParis for a chance to be featured.
